#### **DIRECTORS' NOTE**

Into the Woods is about witches, and beans, and giants, and princes, and a million other things it makes me dizzy. James Lapine's book juggles farce and tragedy, winking at the absurdities of the original tales and then guiding their characters through calamity. Stephan Sondheim's score is a puzzle of overlapping motifs, internal rhymes, wordplay, and psychological nuance. We follow the characters that entered our imaginations as children whether that be through Disney or the Grimm Brothers and venture into the woods on a quest to get their wish. Into the Woods is a cautionary tale about tales that embraces love and forgiveness amidst the decay, and that is why I fell in love with it.

How does this story come to exist in the world? Why is the Narrator recounting this one story with all the separate tales mixed together? Oral storytelling is ancient, intimate, unifying. It is a practice that becomes the core of community and memory in spaces that do not make use of written records. On the other hand, there is an extreme danger when there is only a single arbiter of narrative truth that can divide a collective rather than bond it together. Society deteriorates alongside the deterioration of humanity spurred on by the unquenchable desire for more. People break apart and fight for their own interests without accounting for the seeds they sow until the Giant, both literal and metaphorical, forces a reckoning.

In our production of *Into the Woods*, we have focused on the importance of honoring the extreme loss felt throughout the woods in its various forms. The loss of love, the loss of childhood, the loss of control over one's destiny. When chaos descends on our lives it is so easy to run away especially when we feel like we are flying into a dark hole with no way home. In response, the journey back towards hope in a world that has fallen apart is our most sincere form of human resilience empowered by the working class, by fighters, and by people just trying to find their way. It is a portrait of our world and an earnest reflection of the lives we lead.

Into the Woods has been my How-To Guide to dealing with the grief of life since I began this project in August 2022. I have been lucky enough to have found an artistic home with Muir Musical in 2019. It is a place where I can conjure up a massive dream show like this one and have it turn into reality. It has been a great honor to be in the company of my cast and crew who reminded me of the true joy of creation.

I shall never forget this moment in the woods of my life. I hope you all fall as deeply in love with this show as I have.

## **DRAMATURGS' NOTE**

Stephen Sondheim always echoed the importance of teaching and fostering the next generation of leaders, changemakers, and artists. He aimed to make his work reflect the realities of life with the highest of highs and the lowest of lows and *Into the Woods* is no exception when it comes to these themes. In this case, he points us to four classic fairytales that instill various morals and life lessons for audiences to ponder and internalize.

Cinderella shows us that success and happiness are not guaranteed. Jack and the Beanstalk warns us to not be consumed by greed. Little Red Riding Hood reminds us to be careful with whom we choose to trust. Above all, the Baker and the Baker's Wife encourage us to never give up on our dreams no matter the obstacles. While this story traps us in a memory of childhood, it resembles real-life struggles and hardships.

Classism and socioeconomic status cannot escape even in this mystical world of *Into the Woods*. Behind the nursery rhymes and mythical creatures, this play allows audiences and particularly children, to evaluate our world and find innovative ways to be better. This specific production aims to do just that. By foregoing a traditional recreation of a whimsical fairytale world, we invite you to think more about just childhood dreams. We urge everyone to be more than passive observers and to think about the realities of our world beyond what is told in mass media and broadcasted politics. Ultimately, I ask you how we can be honest about our society's faults but still maintain hope and motivation for a more progressive future.

#### **OUR HISTORY**

Muir Musical was launched in 1991 by a Muir College sophomore, Orren Webber, who had a vision to provide an outlet for students interested in musical theatre who were not necessarily theatre majors.

Before graduating, Orren directed the Muir Musical's first three productions: *Pippin*, *Into the Woods*, and *Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dream Coat*. Except for one single-year hiatus, the Muir Musical has put on a full-scale Broadway musical production every year since its inception.

The legacy that Mr. Webber created has had a significant impact on the UC San Diego campus and in the lives of the thousands of students who work in or enjoy its productions each year. Today, Muir Musical's productions are considered annual arts events that bring UCSD students, faculty, staff, and community members together.

After our production of *Pippin* was regrettably canceled in 2020 due to safety concerns in the ongoing pandemic, Muir Musical produced our first-ever original show, a song cycle titled *Project Symphony*, and shortly after produced our first full-scale digital musical with *Big Fish* in May 2021. In December 2021, we returned with our grand in-person performance of *A Chorus Line* and followed with *American Idiot* in April 2022. Our production of *The Rocky Horror Show* in the Loft was our first cabaret-style immersive show and we are thrilled to be returning to Muir Musical roots with this new production of *Into the Woods*. We look forward to continuing our legacy into the future - creating incredible musicals for our audience to enjoy.

Stephan Sondheim (Music and Lyrics) wrote the music and lyrics for Saturday Night (1954), A FUNNY THING HAPPENED ON THE WAY TO THE FORUM (1962), ANYONE CAN WHISTLE (1964), COMPANY (1970), FOLLIES (1971), A LITTLE NIGHT MUSIC (1973), THE FROGS (1974), PACIFIC OVERTURES (1976). SWEENEY TODD (1979), MERRILY WE ROLL ALONG (1981), SUNDAY IN THE PARK WITH GEORGE (1984). INTO THE WOODS (1987), ASSASSINS (1991), PASSION (1994) and ROAD SHOW (2008) as well as lyrics for WEST SIDE STORY (1957), GYPSY (1959) and DO I HEAR A WALTZ? (1965) and additional lyrics for CANDIDE (1973). He composed the scores of the films "Stavisky" (1974) and "Reds" (1981) and songs for "Dick Tracy" (1990) and the television production "Evening Primrose" (1966). His collected lyrics with attendant essays have been published in two volumes: "Finishing the Hat" (2010) and "Look, I Made A Hat" (2011). In 2010 Broadway's Henry Miller's Theatre was renamed The Stephen Sondheim Theatre in his honour; in 2019, London's Queens Theatre was also renamed the Sondheim.

James Lapine (Book/Original Broadway Director) is a playwright and director. On Broadway he has worked with Stephen Sondheim on SUNDAY IN THE PARK WITH GEORGE; INTO THE WOODS; and PASSION. He also conceived and directed the musical review SONDHFIM ON SONDHEIM. With William Finn he created FALSETTOS recently revived by Lincoln Center Theater; LITTLE MISS SUNSHINE; MUSCLE; and directed Finn's THE 25TH ANNUAL PUTNAM COUNTY SPELLING BEE. Other Broadway credits include his play based on Moss Hart's memoir ACT ONE (also LCT), AMOUR, THE DIARY OF ANNE FRANK, GOLDEN CHILD, and DIRTY BLONDE. He has written the plays TABLE SETTINGS, TWELVE DREAMS, THE MOMENT WHEN, FRAN'S BED and MRS. MILLER DOES HER THING. Lapine has been nominated for eleven Tony Awards, winning on three occasions. He has also been the recipient of the Pulitzer Prize, SDC's Mr. Abbott Award for Lifetime Achievement in the Theater, and inducted into the Theater Hall of Fame.
